THE AWARD WINNING SKYWEST AIRLINES HAS BEEN MEETING THE TRANSPORT NEEDS OF MILLIONS OF WESTERN AUSTRALIANS, DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL TOURISTS FOR MORE THAN 40 YEARS. EACH YEAR, SKYWEST FLIES MORE THAN 300,000 PEOPLE ACROSS WESTERN AUSTRALIA, THE NORTHERN TERRITORY, AND TO BALI, PROVIDING AN ESSENTIAL LINK FOR REGIONAL COMMUNITIES, TOURISTS AND BUSINESSES.

The airline operates a fleet of Fokker 50 turbo-prop and Fokker 100 jet aircraft.

Skywest is the major regional airline in Western Australia, providing scheduled services from Perth to Albany, Esperance, Geraldton, Carnarvon, Exmouth, Broome, Kalgoorlie, Karratha, Kununurra, Leinster, Leonora, Port Hedland Newman and Darwin. Skywest also provides many connector services to Broome – Darwin, Exmouth – Broome, Carnarvon – Exmouth and Port Hedland – Karratha. The airline operates a once-weekly service linking the Pilbara to Bali.

Skywest's regional charter service caters for the specific needs to Government, mining and resources clients, operating aircraft charter services to the state's most remote locations. In October, first time entrant Skywest Airlines reaffirmed its status as Western Australia's premier regional airline, winning the "Major Tour and Transport Operator" category at the 2004 WA Tourism Awards.

Our vision for the future is to be recognised as the leading regional airline in Australia. To achieve this, Skywest has an ongoing commitment to provide a travel experience throughout Western Australia and the Northern Territory at a world class standard. Our focus is on safety, reliability, value for money, and superior inflight service.





The Skywest offer.

SKYWEST'S CORE BUSINESS IS TO PROVIDE SCHEDULED PASSENGER SERVICES WITHIN REGIONAL WESTERN AUSTRALIA AND DARWIN, IN THE NORTHERN TERRITORY. THE AIRLINE ALSO PROVIDES BOTH REGULAR AND AD HOC CHARTERS FOR ITS CUSTOMERS, WITH A FOCUS ON PROVIDING VALUE ADDED SERVICES NOT AVAILABLE TO REGULAR CHARTER OPERATORS. THE COMPANY ALSO OPERATES IN THE AIR FREIGHT MARKET.

Passenger Services

As part of its regular passenger service, Skywest flies to fifteen destinations right across Western Australia and the Northern Territory, with over 220 flights every week. The most recent jet services introduced are Darwin which is serviced three times a week and Kununurra twice a week. All other destinations are serviced either daily or six days a week. In conjunction with Island Bound Holidays, Skywest also flies from the Pilbara to Bali once a week. With the view of consolidation and future growth, Skywest is continually examining opportunities to expand our destination network.


Charter Services

Skywest has significant capacity to provide regular and ad hoc charter services for organisations with "fly-in, fly-out" requirements. With a fleet of Fokker 50's (holding 46 passengers) and Fokker 100 Jets (holding 100 passengers), Skywest can cater for varied regular and ad hoc charter needs. Destinations and flight scheduling can be tailored to suit, with operations into un-sealed runways possible with Fokker 50 aircraft. Current regular charter clients include Argyle Diamonds Mines, Henry Walker Eltin and MacMahon Contractors.

Air Freight

Skywest operates an air freight solution to all destinations in conjunction with our freight partner,

Australian Air Express. Freight needs for pathology, hospitals, vehicle and boat repair. Perishables and live seafood are also handled, providing a valuable service to regional communities.

Our Service Proposition

Our Flight Crew

Skywest prides itself in its people. All Skywest pilots have a wealth of experience with many thousands of flight hours between them. The quality and flight standards of all company pilots and flight attendants are monitored by the Skywest Training and Checking Division, which is dedicated to overseeing all aircrew safety and flying standards.

Skywest's experienced cabin crew ensure flights are as comfortable and enjoyable as possible. Each Skywest Fokker 50 flight is serviced by two cabin crew, with three cabin crew on jet services. All cabin crew members are trained in emergency procedures, including fire fighting, in-flight security, aviation medicine, survival on land and sea. Training of our crew is an ongoing commitment, with our crew assessed for proficiency in all emergency procedures every six months.

Ground Services and Facilities

Skywest passengers depart and arrive Perth via the "Multi-User Domestic Terminal", which is facilities shared with VirginBlue. The terminal offers all the facilities and comfort levels required to meet the needs of our passengers. Terminal facilities include a newsagency, café, and comfortable lounge area.

Skywest Customer Call Centre

The Skywest Worldwide Customer Call Centre is based in Western Australia, and operates extended hours to cater for interstate customers. Our specialised consultants are available seven days a week, for the cost of a local call, anywhere in Australia. The Skywest Customer Call Centre is also available to international customers.





Skywest Holidays

Skywest Holidays is the packaged holiday division of Skywest.

Day to day operations are outsourced through a commercial agreement between Skywest and major tourism provider Great Aussie Holidays. Skywest Holidays offers competitive holiday packages anywhere in Western Australia and the Northern Territory. Skywest holiday packages offer airfare, accommodation and car hire combinations.

Skywest Groups

Skywest Groups offer a comprehensive range of competitive group fares (for groups of ten customers or more) on all Skywest routes. Skywest Groups also offer conference and incentive fares and works closely with the Perth Convention Bureau.

Interline Agreements

Skywest has interline agreements in place with Emirates, Royal Brunei, Singapore Airlines, Thai Airways and Air Paradise. These agreements allow international tourists to book their intrastate /domestic travel with Skywest through their international carrier. This also means that these international airlines can streamline the booking process with having the one reservation. The result is an easier booking system for the traveller, which in itself encourages further regional dispersal for international tourists visiting the major Australian cities.

Skydeals

Skydeals is the retail front of Skywest's Internet fare product. Skydeals represent substantial discounts in the vicinity of 46% - 68% of our full economy airfares. It allows all the convenience of on-line bookings, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. While this fare is considered exclusive to www.skywest.com.au, for an additional service fee, it can also be accessed through a travel agent or the Skywest Customer Service Centre.

Our Distribution Network

Skywest's extensive distribution network gives our organisation strength in our ability to reach domestic and international markets through many channels: The strength of our distribution network is enhanced by our Global Distribution System (GDS) capability, ticketless travel and overseas exposure. Skywest utilises the industry leading "Sabre" computer reservations system.

Development of International Markets

Skywest recognises the interest shown in Western Australia by European markets, and the potential to develop these markets to increase inbound tourism. Skywest has recently appointed a European representative, based in Italy, to promote Western Australian destinations throughout Europe.

Regional Advisory Boards

Skywest has established Regional Advisory Boards in each of our major ports. Each of the boards, consist of 6-10 local residents, business and local council representatives, who contribute feedback concerning Skywest's local flight services, including pricing, scheduling, ease of use and any other related issues that concern the community. Meeting one to two times per year, the boards have been established by Skywest with the objective of providing the best possible services that are aligned with community needs.



Fleet Information

Fleet Structure

Skywest fleet consists of Fokker 50 turbo-prop aircraft and Fokker 100 jets.

Fokker 50 Aircraft

The Fokker 50 aircraft is configured with 46 seats for Skywest operations, ensuring a high level of comfort including air-conditioning, ample cabin baggage space, extended seat pitch (extra leg room) and full in –flight catering facilities. The in-flight services are of a standard comparable to that of much larger jet aircraft. The aircraft are ideally suited to WA operating conditions offering a fast, efficient and comfortable service, with the best payload/range characteristics in its class. The high-winged design is also well suited to gravel runways in the more remote locations.



Fokker 100 Jet Aircraft

The Fokker 100 is a modern jet aircraft that has all the features expected in an aircraft of this class. Maximum economical cruise speed is 760 km/h, which together with an unrestricted climb to its maximum cruise altitude of 35,000 feet allows this jet to offer a service standard second to none. The Fokker 100 also has the smallest noise footprint of any jet aircraft in its class and can operate to most sealed airports without the need for major modifications to the local infrastructure. The Fokker 100 offers extended leg room and full inflight catering facilities.

Quality Assurance Systems


Skywest's Engineering Department is quality accredited to AS/NZS ISO9001:2000. This occurred in November 2003 when the previous standard AS/NZS ISO9002:1994 was superceded.

The accreditation has helped enormously with the compliance toward system based audits used by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) in checking High Capacity Operations.

The elements of the standard are based on having a Certificate of Approval and around Civil Aviation Regulation 30. Along with having a good quality system, it is important that there is a very robust internal review process that supports the system. Skywest has audit programs set up in the Engineering, Flight Operations and the Ground Operations Departments to provide the Skywest Board and Management with regular reviews on the compliance of each department to policy and procedures. These audits have extended to encompass major suppliers who provide repair and overhaul services for aircraft components and ground handling contracting staff to maintain the standard of the quality system away from the main facility.

Its planned in the future to role out this accreditation to all operational parts of our business and with the new CASA legislation soon to be introduced to the industry, the quality and safety systems are seen as focal points in the future growth of the business.

The Company Board, has a dedicated safety security and environment committee that oversees the direction of safety and quality within the organization and realises that adequate resources must be provided in these areas in order for the company to maintain the very high reputation for safety which it currently enjoys.
